EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Presentation: John Allison Elementary School Student Learning

The teachers described how the classes researched their non-fiction writing projects on animals and the students presented their reports to the Board.

A letter has been sent to the Minister of Education reporting underspent funds for the 2017/2018 school year and providing the 2018/2019 Aboriginal Education program plans with the supplemental funding, including the underspent funding from previous years.

BC School Trustee Association Workbook

The Superintendent distributed a memo regarding the BC School Trustees Association Leadership Series Workbook. He discussed working through the assignments in the workbook, allowing Trustees a better understanding of their role prior to the Leadership Series in April 2019. Trustees are scheduled to meet with the Superintendent and the Secretary Treasurer on April 11, 2019 in Kelowna to finalize the workbook together.

Early Initiative Grant

The Superintendent circulated correspondence from the Ministry of Education informing the Board of a \$35,000 grant awarded to the District to support mental health and well-being.
