## Equity Scan - Ministry of Education Presentation

Superintendent McNiven introduced Joe Heslip from the Ministry of Education who presented to the Board on the Equity in Action Project. It will define a collective and collaborative decision-making process for school districts to enter into a genuine and meaningful self-assessment dialogue about the experience of education for Indigenous learners and to respond in strategic ways to create conditions for success. The Equity in Action Project is scheduled for the fall of 2021.
